Upscale travelers choose United for best frequent-flyer program

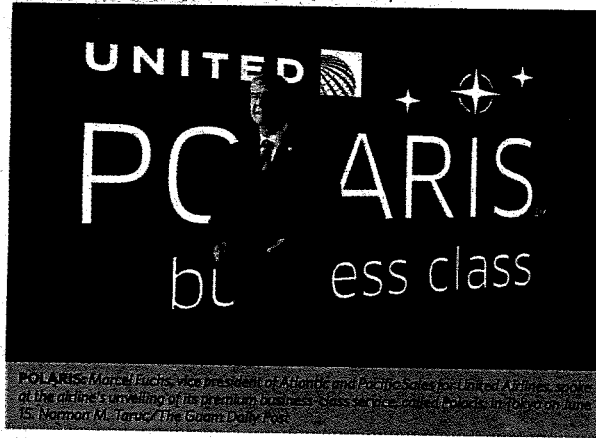
