KWONIL JUNG CLINICAL PHARMACIST

Kwonil had two great catches this month! Upon review of physician orders, Kwonil identified duplicate antibiotic therapy which could contribute to an adverse event and risk of antibiotic resistance development to the patient. The order was clarified with the physician and the duplicate coverage order was discontinued before the patient received the medication.

Kwonil's second good catch happened while performing medication reconciliation. While working with a community pharmacy, he identified a home medication that had not been included in the inpatient listing. He contacted the physician who then made the necessary adjustments to the inpatient orders so the patient would continue to receive this needed medication.



MARGARET KANG CLINICAL PHARMACIST

Margaret reported the collaboration among pharmacists, both at our hospital and community pharmacies to complete medication reconciliation of a high risk home medication that was to be continued during the patient's inpatient stay so the patient would receive the correct dose.

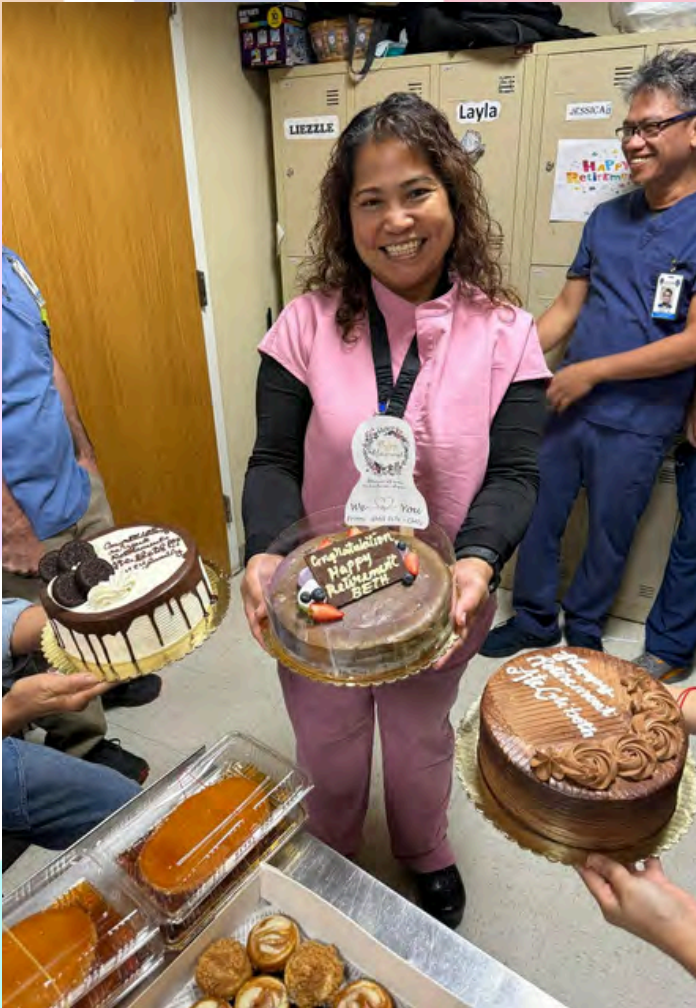
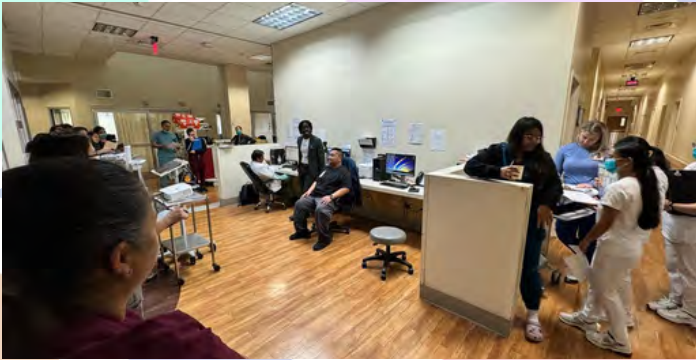
